Autumn 2 The Great Fire of London.

To support the learning in school please complete <u>at least 3</u> of these activities over the course of this half term. You can choose to do one per week if you would like.

- > Make a fire Safety poster, explaining how to stay safe at a Bonfire.
- Go on an Autumn walk and collect different coloured leaves. Can you use these to create a piece of natural art work. Take a picture.



- Can you find a clip (searching google) to find out an interesting fact about The Great Fire of London.
- Can you make a Tudor house out of a cereal box think about what the houses were made out of.
- Can you draw and label a local habitat in your area (eg your garden or the local park) and draw and label the plants and animals you would find living there.
- Go on a walk and draw a simple map of the different plants you find on the way.
- Think back to your learning from Geography last term can you think of a large habitat (continent) What animals would live there and how do they survive? Present you answers in your own way.
