SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

The wearing of School Uniform is encouraged for a number of reasons -

- a uniform is smart and encourages a sense of identity;
- it prevents undesirable "fashion competitions" between pupils and, most important for parents,
- it prevents the perpetual battle about what to wear and what "everyone else" is wearing.

Details of our School Uniform options are as follows: -

Each child also requires a red, blue or yellow "T"- shirt depending on the house they are assigned to, scarlet shorts, a pair of trainers and a pair of black plimsolls. These items should be kept in a draw-string bag in school every day during term-time but should be checked regularly for cleanliness and fit. A spare pair of socks is advisable particularly for those children wearing tights in the winter months. Children are encouraged to bring black jogging bottoms or leggings for outdoor activities during colder weather. A school hoodie is available or children are asked to wear their jumpers/cardigans.

JEWELLERY & WATCHES

The wearing of jewellery (rings, bracelets, necklaces, brooches, clip-on earrings etc) in school is not allowed.

Watches may be worn, but audible alarms should be switched off. Watches must be removed for P.E. lessons and other physical activities.

Children with pierced ears may wear small stud earrings, which must be removed for P.E. and sport lessons.

The school will not accept responsibility for any injury caused by the wearing of earrings, nor for the loss of earrings or watches.

PRESENTATION
